"I am an undertaker," was the reply. ---Selected.

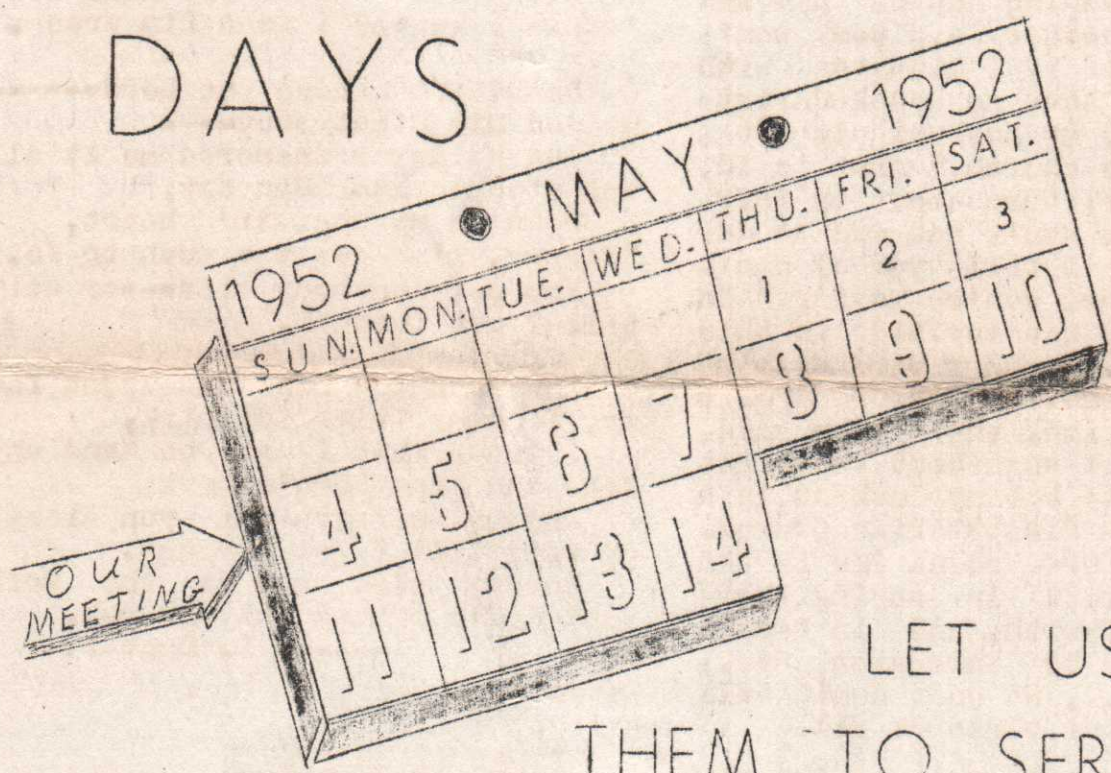
