

QUESTIONS BIBLE ANSWERS MISCELLANEOUS QUESTIONS

I received a letter a few days ago, with five questions, requesting me to answer them in our little paper. Some of these questions are scarcely worth answering since the querist seems to want to quibble over some things. Therefore, my answer to some of them will be brief. I will not print the whole letter now, in order to preserve space, but I will quote each question verbatim as we answer them.

1. "Where did you get the baptistry from? Did the New Testament Church have one?"

ANS. Our Lord often ask tions to answer a question that was ask him. So, let us ask our querist, where did you get your song books, or where is your authority for having them? Did the New Testament have them? If so where is the book chapter and verse that says so? Where did you get your church house? Did the New Testament Church have one? I do not at this moment recall having read in the New Testament where the church ever owned a building to meet in. Yet, they probally had song books, and maybe some of the congregation s had a meeting house. Anyway, we do know that they met in some building, whether it was owned by the church or not.

Yes, the New Testament Church had a baptistry. Or at least we do know that they used one. Whether it was in the building in which they met or in some creek or river it makes no difference. They had to have a baptistry before they could baptize. A baptistry is a place where people are baptized; so in that sense a river could be refered to as the baptistry of the Church. If not, why not?

2. "In one of your papers you said a harp is vocal cords. You gave Mr. Webster as reference, but you did not say what he said about harp, you looked up the word voice What does he say about harp?"

ANS. Our querist knows what Mr Webster says about harps, but for the benefit of all our readers, we give here his definition. musical stringed instrument triangular shape, played with the fingers: to play on the harp; dwell tediously or persistently on some particular subject (with on or upon)." Now, if this justifies the use of musical instruments in worship, it also restricts it to the kind described, namely: They must be "stinged instruments"---they must be of "triangular shape" This certainly will eliminate many instruments of music used in wo-

rship today.

Let us now observe a few other things in the reference to which our querist refers, Rev. 5:8-9. You will note in verse 8 that John speaking of the elders says, each one has a harp. "Having EVERY ONE of them harps." Therefore, if this justifies instruments of music in worship, every worshiper must have a harp, but it is not done that way in any church today. But the fact is "harps" here is used in a figurative sense just as the other things mentioned in this verse. In the latter part of this verse John speaks of "golden vials full of odours, WHICH ARE THE PRAYERS of saints." Is prayers carried in literal "golden vials" today? Is prayers actually and literally "odours?" The answers to these questions are positively, No! I think those who use musical instruments in their worship would agree that the things I have mentioned (Centinued Page 4)

here are used in a figurative sense. But they want to make "harps" literal. "Consistency thou art a jewell."

But John you said, "having every one of them harps," What did they do with them? "They sung a new song, SAYING....." Rev.5:9. Here we have the answer of the one who said they had harps. He said they SUNG. This will forever settle the matter for those who want to know the truth. And I wonder if our querist is honest enough to accept it. If she is honest she will repent of her sins in using a musical instrument in worship, and will never again attempt worship God with a musical instrument.

3. "How can anyone belong to a church and not be a member? According to your last weeks' paper you can."

ANS. How our querist ever came to such a conclusion from reading my article in the January 20th, issue, I must confess I do not know. I do not have any idea what part of the article she has reference to. If she will write and let me know what she has reference to I will give further consideration to the matter.
