## SIN SAPS STRENGTH

-In Baltimore, one Sunday morning as the people were going to church, a telegraph pole large and strong and round, suddenly, without warning, like a great strong man struck down by an unseen bullet, groaned, and then, tearing, with a groaning sound, crashed to the street. leaving about 25 feet standing. A crowd soon gathered, wondering what had caused the incident. Just then a small boy began to climb the stump to investigate. When he reached the top he found right at the place where the pole had broken that a pair of wood peckers had cut out their nest.

Unnoticed, but steadily, stroke after stroke the birds had dug their way back into the heart of that great telegraph pole until they had sapped its strength. Sometimes a man may come crashing down. His outer life has seemed strong, and round and respectable. The whole world marvels at it: but after a little bit it is discovered that some secret sin had

eaten into his heart -- thus the crash.

## SEA OF GALILEE

—(This is the first in a series of Biblical terms, names, and places to be presented for the benefit of those who wish to know more about things of this nature.)

-The Sea of Galilee is so called from the province of Galilee, which bordered on its western side. It was also called the "Sea of Tiberias," from the celebrated city of that name. (Jno. 6:1). At its northwestern angle was a beautiful and fertile plain called the "Gennesaret," and from that it derived the name of "Lake of Gennesaret." (Luke 5:1) It was called in the Old Testament "the Sea of Chinnereth" or "Cinneroth," (Num. 34:11; Josh. 12:3; I Ki. 15:20), from a town of that name which stood on or near its shore. (Josh. 19:35) Its modern name is Bahr Tubariyeh. Most of our Lord's public life was spent in the environs of this sea. The surrounding region was then the most densely peopled in all Palestine. About the Lake there were ten or twelve flourishing towns. The Sea of Galilee is of an oval or pear-shape, about thirteen miles long and six broad. The river Jordan enters it at its northern end and passes out at its southern end. In fact the bed of the lake is just a lower section of the great Jordan valley. Its most remarkable feature is its deep depression, being no less than 700 fect below the level of the ocean. It is exposed to frequent sudden and violent storms owing to the great number of hills.

—On the east and west the hills rise abruptly, almost forming a mountain wall. To the north and south also are hills, though the slopes are much more gradual. Not only Jews but people of many races have praised the beauty of the Sea of Galilee. Now it is bleak and barren, and the shores lined with ruins.

The great depression makes the climate almost tropical. This is very sensibly felt by the traveler in going down from the plains of Galilee. In summer the heat is intense, and even in early spring the air has something of an Egyptian balminess. The water of the lake is sweet, cool and transparent; and as the beach is everywhere pebbly it has a beautiful sparkling look. It abounds in fish now as in ancient times. There were large fisheries on the lake, and much commerce was carried on upon it. (Peloubits Bible Dictionary)
